It's *The Little Theatre of Alexandria's* current production of Monty Python's "Spamalot". *LTA* always gives us great musicals and this one is no exception. It's just great!! The story centers around King Arthur (James Hotsko, Jr.) and his search for the Holy Grail. "Spamalot" is a spoof on Camelot with parodies of all the familiar songs. The acting, singing, choreography, costumes, lighting and sets are all first class. There's a huge cast of wonderfully talented singers and dancers with multiple costume changes and dialects. Hotsko is a flawless King Arthur and Ashlia-Amber Harris as the Lady of the Lake is a knock-out. Can she ever belt out a song---wow! And can she ever fill out a gold lamé jump suit.
